

What will our students study?



Students will taking exams in the following core subjects:

English Language, English Literature, Mathematics and Science

Students will also study core PE and PSHCE which are nonexamined courses.

The Qualifications



Students will be choosing their level 2 qualifications choices.

Level 2 qualifications include GCSEs, NCFE technical qualifications and diplomas.

Some options will have NEAs or Non-Examination
Assessments which are a substantial part of the final grade.
Students will need to ensure that these assessments are completed to their best ability to reach their potential.





Some students may have an idea about what they want to do and the careers they want to undertake the majority of people will not know, will change their mind and will find that they undertake a number of different careers roles in their lifetime.









It is important to ensure that our students and prepare them for the changing careers landscape that they have a broad and balanced curriculum, to equip them with the skills for these changes.









It is about keeping the doors to future study and career choices open.







Level 2 qualification choices and results are looked at by Universities when students are completing their UCAS applications.




