New Top Class Student Rewards

Firstly, the school's system of behaviour points and sanctions has undergone a renewal, including the introduction of the Conduct Improvement Room for students who need time to reflect on behavioural choices. Secondly, and more excitingly, the Senior Leadership Team has reinstated the long-awaited addition of school trips as a reward for students who meet all four standards of being a Top Class student throughout the school year. These trips include visits to the cinema, theme parks, and a Stopsley High School fair, and they will take place on a termly basis. 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International Literacy Day

International Literacy Day takes place on the 8th of September each year to raise awareness about the importance of literacy and numeracy, promoting the skills as a global human right. The event is a worldwide celebration and was set up by the UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization) more than 60 years ago as a special day to celebrate reading and writing.

Today, lots and lots of progress is being made across the world to ensure that everyone receives their rightful literacy skills, although it's still thought that at least 763 million young people and adults lack basic literacy skills, like reading and writing. Currently, 1 in 3 children globally don't even receive a quality primary education. Missing out on school puts children at a higher risk of abuse, child marriage, and lower earning potential. Recent crises such as COVID-19, climate change and conflicts have also impacted literacy progress deepening inequalities around the world.

This year's International Literacy
Day was celebrated worldwide
under the theme, 'Promoting
literacy for a world in transition:
Building the foundation for
sustainable and peaceful
societies'. A global conference was
organised in person and online on
Friday, 8 September 2023, in Paris,
France. This global celebration
included the award ceremony of
the UNESCO International Literacy
Prizes to announce this year's
outstanding prizewinning
programmes.


Year 7 Sport at Stopsley
